Founded in 1970, E4C is a charitable human services organization providing multiple and diverse range of services. E4C works to achieve effective, collaborative efforts in response to need and emergent issues.

We focus on people. E4C is present and active at a time of need providing a range of programs and services. These services extend through a full range, beginning with comfort and care, extending to innovative and transformative services that lead to positive change, and increasing capacity.

We participate in networks and associations, joint ventures and partnerships in helping people connect with resources and with the community. E4C is committed to changing lives for the better and to growing stronger communities.

Courage

E4C Services include:
Nutrition & Community Services

The School Lunch Program feeds over 2300 hungry children every school day at high-needs schools. The Snack Program gives funding to schools to provide a mid-morning snack to over 6,300 elementary children or a drop-in breakfast program to junior high students as well as providing nutritious snacks throughout the summer months at city park sites. Make Tax Time Pay provides tax preparation assistance in the Edmonton area at no cost to individuals and families.



Early Learning Services

ArtStart is a low-cost, high quality arts exposure program for children ages 6 to 12. We provide lessons in Music, Dance, Drama & Visual Art as well as field trips and other exciting opportunities. Clareview Head Start and the Early Head Start programs provide preschool children and their parents a head start in child development and school readiness as well as offer early intervention programs which provide support, information and services. The Northeast Community Program is a recreational program for children and youth.

Transitional Services

Crossroads Program offers alternatives, support and hope to children and adults involved in prostitution and sexual exploitation. Elizabeth House offers 24 homeless women short-term accommodation and assistance in their integration back into the community. WEAC provides 75 emergency beds, meals, transportation, and security for women in a 24-hour-a-day facility. Women Moving Forward is a comprehensive project that provides pre-employment support and training to homeless women.

Housing & Mental Health Ser

The Case Management Team works to reduce homelessness by providing focused outreach support to E4C service users. Meadow's Place and its four satellite houses offer long-term housing to 20 people with a history of ongoing mental illness. McCauley Apartments, contains 37 two-bedroom subsidized suites—some for people on limited incomes and some for those with mental illnesses. Our Place offer women with mental illness supported long-term housing. Sorensen Place has 17 subsidized self-contained bachelor units. G-C Place, Our Other Place and Stollery Place are three complexes in the inner city which are self-contained bachelor units for low income people who may suffer from a mental illness and can live independently. Gold Nugget Suites has 10 self-contained bachelor suites for low-income singles. Holmes Place has 10 one-bedroom units and is a long-term, third stage supportive housing project.



Social Enterprise

Kids in the Hall Bistro Program enables at-risk youth to develop life and job skills through an innovative partnership between business and the community. The Financial Management Program offers human service charities professional financial services at a reduced rate, allowing non-profit organizations to put the savings towards their core mission. It fills the gap between the need for quality professional financial services and the cost of these services for charities.

Youth receive job training and a chance to be heard and respected for who they are.

For those living in desperate circumstances, E4C provides emergency and transitional services, giving hope, healing and shelter to individuals moving on to a better life.

Believing that everyone deserves more than just a roof over their heads, we are committed to providing and advocating for a range of affordable housing alternatives where those of modest incomes can have a safe and affordable place to call home.

E4C has a commitment to provide supportive transitional housing for people working to leave life on the streets and to build a healthy personal future. We have designated housing resources in both the city and in rural Alberta for this purpose.
