What is Elizabeth House?

Elizabeth House is a warm, inviting home that provides an essential program for women who are taking steps from being homeless to living independently. Residents have a calm, quiet environment and given assistance as they pursue their goals.

Elizabeth House residents are primarily referred from the Women's Emergency Accommodation Centre (WEAC) as the next step from emergency housing to independent living. However, we do also take referrals and calls from community agencies, past residents and potential residents.



Elizabeth House is a 24-bed facility for homeless women and transgendered individuals. It provides support in their integration back into the community and weekly on-site counseling is available.

What services does Elizabeth House provide?

Working with homeless women means that we see and address many different issues, including addictions, prostitution, violence and abuse, and mental health issues.

Through our 24 hour staffing model we provide support and referrals to community resources that help residents to gain the necessary skills to move back into the community. Residents are involved with programs that meet their goals. They are expected to eventually move to their own individual apartments with the support of other E4C programs like Women Moving Forward, Crossroads and the Case Management Team.

Services provided include:

- Meals
- Emergency clothing
- Telephone access
- Administering medication
- Laundry facilities
- Crisis intervention
- Service planning

Elizabeth House has regular activities including:

- Monthly painting parties
- Movie nights
- Summer barbecues
- Weekend Aqua Fit classes
- Winter Gathering
- Christmas Tea parties
- Shared domestic responsibilities

How long has Elizabeth House been serving the community?

Elizabeth House was established in 1991 when the Anglican Nuns of St. John the Divine Priory sold the building to E4C. Elizabeth House staff works in partnership with WEAC to offer women a stable environment so they can work on returning to their community. The Women Moving Forward Program is also on-site program that provides support for residents who are looking to return to work or school.



Residents continue to comment on the home like and peaceful environment that Elizabeth House provides. Residents keep some flowers around the house and also maintain a small vegetable garden in the back yard.
