Meadow's Place offers hope and safe, supported housing for adult males with mental health issues. All people are accepted at their starting point and are helped to achieve and maintain their highest level of personal growth, well-being and independence.



Meadow's Place and its four satellite houses offer long-term housing to 16 males over the age of 18 diagnosed with varying types of mental illness. Meadows Place is the main house and accommodates six residents and is staffed 24/7. The four satellite houses consist of two houses with three residents in each and two with four residents. Some individuals have the ability to live independently while others are given as much assistance as they require.

Staff also maintain a communication link with other service professionals working with the residents. Residents are provided with the chance to get involved



in their community through volunteer opportunities and attending community events. Residents also have access to on-site visits from a pharmacy and have the support of a community mental health professional.

Residents are provided with assistance in:

- Improving living skills
- Gaining entry into additional programs
- Complying with medication or other treatment programs
- Attending medical or personal appointments
- Informal counseling
- Social support
- Recreational opportunities
- Meals
- Establishing and maintaining their own service network

Meadow's Place is not just a group home but a safe haven; a place that residents can call home while receiving support. The environment at Meadow's Place is a relaxed pleasant atmosphere where kindness and compassion is shown to all. It's a long-term housing project where true friendships and bonds are formed and maintained.

"I am Daniel; I have lived in Meadow's Place for the past 15 years. Meadow's is my second home. Staff have assisted me to develop life skills; we go to games and festivals, outings, to play pool and bowling. Meadows Place has helped me to interact with the community, meet new people, and build new relationships. I left Meadows for three months, then I came back because I felt very isolated living in my apartment. We live here like a family, and most important is that staff accepts you as the person you are. Changes take time and staff supports you in this process, so you can make positive changes in life."
